## 1.3 Safety and Maintenance 1.3.1 Using the Phone

### Please observe the following points:

- Before use, please read the instruction manual carefully.
- Don't power on the phone when the use of a cellular phone is prohibited as it may cause interruptions / danger.
- While using the phone, please keep away from heat source and high voltage environments, such as electric
  appliances or electric cooking devices. Please use the phone under normal operating temperatures.
- Only the original supplied battery, charger and accessories should be used.
- Phone may cause interference to nearby electronic devices, therefore keep it away from electronic devices such as radios, PC's, pacemakers, hearing aids, etc. Do not place the phone near credit cards or any magnetic fields
- Do not disassemble the phone Any unauthorized work performed on the phone will void the warranty.
- Don't use benzene, thinners, alcohol, or corrosive chemicals such as detergent to clean the cover of your phone.
- Your phone is not water-proof, so please keep it dry. Do not use it in damp environment, such as a bathroom.
   Keep it away from rain and moisture.

## 1.3.2 Using the Battery

#### Please observe the following points:

- Before use, please read instructions for use as well as label on the surface of the battery.
- Please charge the battery in a cool and well-ventilated room as high temperatures may lead to overheating.
- Do not attempt open the battery as it may lead to short circuit or electrolyte leakage.
- If electrolytes get in contact with your eyes, there is danger of blindness.
- In such case, immediately wash your eyes with clean water and seek medical attention immediately (Do not rub your eyes)
- Keep the battery away from mechanical vibration and shaking. Do not short connect the battery as this may
  damage the battery and components connected to it.
- · Keep the metal contact points and battery clean.
- Do not use damaged or depleted batteries.
- The battery should be replaced when it cannot meet the requirement for performance. Battery can be charged hundreds of times before it should be replaced.
- Though it can be charged hundreds of times, its quantity of electric charge may decrease gradually. When
  service time (talk time and standby time) is found to have decreased, the battery needs to be replaced.
- Prevent the battery from exposure to the skin or places with excessive smoke or dust. Do not use it in damp environments, such as a bathroom. The battery is not waterproof; so keep it away from rain and moisture.
- Do not put the battery in places that are too hot or too cold. Temperature above 55 degrees Celsius or below -10 degrees Celsius may affect performance of the battery.
- Do not put the battery in an open fire as this could lead to an explosion.
- Do not put the battery in water to avoid short circuit inside, resulting in battery overheat, smoking, distortion, damage or even explosion.
- Treat battery according to local regulations (for example, recycling). Do not treat battery as domestic garbage.
- Only the original charger supplied with the phone should be used for charging the battery.

- Using another type of battery, charger or generic accessories may violate the certification or warranty terms of equipment and may result in damage.

## 1.3.3 Using the Battery Charger

#### Please observe the following points:

- Before use, please read the user instructions as well as the label on the surface of the charger.
- Do not disassemble or modify the charger or use it when power cable is damaged.



- Do not touch the charger with wet hands. If the charger connects with water or other liquid, immediately cut
  off the power supply.
- Do not short connect the charger and keep it away from mechanical vibration or shaking and direct sun shine.
- Do not use it in damp environments, such as a bathroom.
- The battery charger is not waterproof; keep it away from rain and moisture.
- Keep the charger out of reach of children to avoid danger as components may pose choking hazard.

## 2. Instructions before Use

Before using the phone, make sure the USB jack, power adapter or battery is correctly connected and the SIM card has been inserted correctly. Follow the instructions below:

### INSTALLATION

Ensure the DWR-720 /PW is powered off before performing the steps below.

01

Flip the phone around and open the Battery Cover at the bottom of the device.



03

Open the MicroSD card holder and insert the MicroSD card flat into the groove.



02

Insert and slide the SIM Card into place as shown above.



04

Insert the Battery with the metal end on the bottom left. Close Battery Cover.



**Note:** The battery comes partially charged. You can use the device while charging.

Screw the antenna into the TNC Antenna Port



07

Plug the other end of the handset cord into the headset port on the back of the phone and clip the cord into the cord clip.



09

On the front of the device, hold the Red End call / Power key for ±5 seconds.

A loading screen will display to indicate that the phone is starting up.



### 06

Plug the one end of the handset cord into the handset receiver.



80

Connect the USB point of the Power Adapter to the USB power jack on the left side of the phone.

Plug the power adapter into a wall outlet.



10

If prompted for a PIN number enter the 4 digit PIN indicated on the larger card supplied with the SIM card. Push the left Soft Key and select "OK" to unlock.



Note: If the phone has no signal or shows "Mobile Network Not Available" when trying to dial please phone Telkom on 081 180 to verify that your SIM is active and your area has coverage.

**Warning:** Before pulling out the SIM card, the phone should be powered off. Inserting or pulling out SIM cards is not permitted when the external power is connected as it can damage the SIM card.

## 2.1 Power ON

- The device can work on single battery mode, single charger mode or both battery and charger mode.
- Press and hold [Red Power Key] button until boot screen appears
- If there is a prompt for Type PIN code, please enter your SIM PIN code and press [Unlock] key.
- Should you type in the SIM PIN code incorrectly 3 times, the SIM will be locked and can only be unlocked with the PUK code.

Note: Please contact your service provider for the default SIM PIN code if unavailable.

- After power on, if the SIM card is valid or inserted correctly, your phone will automatically search available network to connect
- If the SIM card is invalid or inactive or incorrectly inserted, it will prompt you to Insert SIM card or Emergency Calls only.



### 2.2 Power OFF

To power off, press and hold the [Red Power key] until power off screen appears.

**Note:** In this state, all alarms will still sound if set. Power off the phone and disconnect the external power whenever inserting the battery or SIM card.

## 2.3 Phone Security

You can set an SIM password to avoid unauthorized use of your phone SIM.

This can be done under section 10.7 Settings > Security > SIM Lock

**Set up SIM card lock:** Set SIM PIN lock to on or off, or modify SIM PIN. Note that the SIM PIN number is issued by your network provider and is shown on your Complete SIM card. If a SIM PIN is set, it will be indicated with a tick.

### 2.4 PIN code

- PIN code is used to prevent illegal use of user's SIM card.
- If your SIM has PIN code protection enabled, you will be prompted to enter your PIN code on start-up.
- If the wrong PIN code is entered three times consecutively the SIM card will be automatically soft locked.
- You will be required to enter the PUK code to unlock it.

**Note:** The PIN code is related to SIM card, not the telephone and is provided by your Network Service Provider. Please contact your service provider if you do not know your SIM PIN code.

### 2.5 PUK code

- PUK code, referring to Personal Unlock Code, is used to unlock a SIM card that is locked because of wrong input of PIN code.
- If the PUK code entry attempts exceed ten times, the SIM card will be hard locked and a SIM replacement will be required.
- PUK codes or Replacement SIM cards are provided by your Network Service Provider.

## 2.6 microSD Card format & specification

#### Installation

- Step 1: Slide the clip to the right carefully. You will hear a small click and the clip will now be loose.
- Step 2: Flip open the clip by softly lifting it to the right and place the microSD Card down flat into the groove with the pins facing down to the right.
- Step 3: Close the clip by flipping the cover left and softly press down and slide the clip to the left to lock. You
  will hear a small click and the clip is now locked.

#### Compatible microSD Card Format & Types

The DWR-720PW is compatible with most microSD Cards with the following specifications:

- microSD card format type: FAT32
- Memory Capacity: Up to 32GB (Gigabytes)
- Speed: microSD cards with slow speed may experience slow transfer time when loading files, or may not work
  at all. Slow transfer times can also occur with microSD cards that have a great number of files on them.

If the SD-Card is inserted and the icon shows !! , it means there is format issue, this can be fixed by referring to section

14. File Manager

**Note:** If the microSD card is placed in the phone correctly and the SD card icon does not show up on the top bar, it means this card is not compatible. Check your microSD card meets the specification or try another microSD card.

The DWR-720PW is compatible with the following file types:

- Video File types: .3gp, .mp4,
- Audio File types: .aac, .flac, .m4a, .mid, .mp3, .ogg, .wav,
- File name Extensions: .gif, .jpg, .png, .bmp

## 3. Basic Functions

#### 3.1 Direct dial

#### Making a phone call:

- In Home Screen, press the numerical key to enter the phone number then pick up the handset to dial or press the [Green Dial key] to initiate the call on hands free loudspeaker.
- Or pick up the handset to initiate dialling tone, enter the phone number and press [Green Dial key] to initiate
  the call.

- Press [Right soft key] to delete the last digit or long press it to clear all if you entered the number incorrectly.
- Pick up the handset or press [Hands Free] for the dialling tone.
- If the phone number being dialled out is recognized by the phonebook, the name of contact person will be displayed on the dialling screen as well as the calling screen.
- To end the call, press the [End Call/Red Power key] or press the [Hands Free key] or simply hang up.

#### Quick dial from contacts list:

- In Home Screen, press the [Right soft key] to enter [Contacts].
- Scroll down to select a contact and press the [Green Dial key] to initiate the call on hands free loudspeaker.
- To switch over to handset calling, pick up the handset.

### 3.2 Quick dial from dialled list

- In Home Screen, press the [Green Dial key] to enter [Outcall number] list.
- · Scroll down to the previous number you have dialled or received a call from.
- · Press the [Green Dial key] again to initiate the call.

### 3.3 Receive a call

- When there is an incoming call, the screen will display the phone number together with ringtone (unless the phone is set to silent).
- Press the [Green Dial key] or pick up the handset or Press [Hands Free] to answer calls.
- If phone number of the caller is not hidden, the number will be displayed on the incoming call screen.
- If the contact information of the caller is stored in contacts, then the caller's name will be displayed.

**Note:** If the caller ID is hidden or the network bans call indication, the incoming call is displayed as \*\*\*\* or Private or Unknown.

## 3.4 Operations during a call

- During a call, you have the option to:
- Back stage: Press the right soft key to return the screen to home page. You can now access the Menu and Contacts.
- Hold: Press the left soft key [OK] for the hold option. Place the current call on hold.



Mute: Press the left soft key [OK] for the mute option. This will cut off the microphone on the phone.

Add a call: Press the left soft key [OK] for the Add a call option. You can phone another caller while you are busy on a call. This will place the first call on hold. To swap between the 2 calls, press [OK] then [Swap].

#### 3.5 Terminate call

- When there is an incoming call, press the [Red Power key] to reject the call.
- During the call, press the [Red Power key] to terminate current call. Or hang up the handset.
- If hands free calling, press the [Hands Free] key to end the current call.
- A number that has just been dialled can be cancelled by pressing [Red Power key].

## 3.6 Make Emergency call

- As long as you are within coverage of network, you can make an emergency call even if you have not registered to the local network or do not have SIM card or have not yet unlocked the SIM.
- Enter the local emergency number and then press [Green Dial key] to make an emergency call.

## 3.7 Make International long-distance call

- Press and hold the [0] key until the "+" sign appear before international phone number can be dialled. "+" sign tells the network that you are making an international call.
- Enter the country code, area code (without the 0) and phone number
- Press [Green Dial key] to initiate the call.

Note: Some networks do not allow "+" for dialling international numbers.


To Edit the details of an existing contact.

- Note: You can change the input method by pressing the # key


To Delete a contact, you can do it 2 ways:

- Security: Configuration settings for Set up SIM card lock and Screen lock
- Fast dialling: Used to configure fast dial keys when you press and hold a number key on the home screen
- **Bluetooth:** Enable/Disable Bluetooth feature, Scan & Pair other Bluetooth devices to Phone
- Factory data reset: Here you can reset and erase all data on the phone.
- **Phone Info:** Here you can view Status, Model, Versions and Build number for the Phone

## 10.1 Display



Under the Display setting, you have the option to:

- **Brightness:** You can adjust the light intensity for the background light that illuminates the screen. Use the left or right key to adjust the brightness level from dim to bright
- **Display Dim:** If no key is pressed with a set period, the background light will **dim** automatically. This is to protect the LCD screen and save battery life. The default time is set to 5 minutes.

Additional Feature "**Return to Home Page**" can be enabled to return the screen to the Home Page when the screen dims. By default this feature is disabled.

- Font size: You can set display font size: Small/Normal/Large/Extra-large
- Interface style: This will adjust the layout of the Menu Screen, you can select between Default/Grid/Big Grid



### **Return to Home Page setting**

This feature is used to return the user to the Home Page when the phone display dims. When enabled, the phone will automatically return the current screen to the Home Page when the display dims. If disabled, the screen will remain on the same page when the display dims.

#### To Enable:

- Select Display Dim and set the time in which you wish for the display to dim, and press the left soft key to confirm.
- 2. A pop-up message will be displayed. Confirm by selecting [OK] and the left soft key to confirm
- 3. Choose [Enable] and press the left soft key to confirm.

Note: During a phone call, the screen will return to the Home Page when the screen dims. To return to the call screen, press the green dial button.

#### To Disable:

- Select Display Dim and set the time in which you wish for the display to dim, and press the left soft key to confirm.
- 2. A pop-up message will be displayed. Confirm by selecting [OK] and the left soft key to confirm
- 3. Choose [Disable] and press the left soft key to confirm.

### 10.2 Sound



Under the Sound setting, you have the option to:

- **Volume**: Adjust the volume for Music, Ringtone & Notifications, Alarms. Press left or right to adjust the volume and up or down to change the selection. Once done, scroll down to the bottom and select [OK]
- **Phone ringtone:** You can change the ringtone here, press the [left soft key] to
- **Default notification sound:** You can change the notification sound for alerts here
- **Touch sounds:** You can change the keypad tone volume here, select between Close / low / medium / high (Volume Off / soft / normal / loud)

## 10.3 Language

You can set your phone language display to English, Español, Português

## 10.4 Call settings



Under the Call settings, you have the option to:

- Voice Call: You can set Voicemail, Call forwarding, Call barring, Additional settings
- Fixed Dialling Numbers (FDN): Numbers can be added to the FDN list, and when activated, FDN restricts outgoing calls to only those numbers listed, or to numbers with certain prefixes
- Minute reminder: Enable/Disable reminder at 50s of every minute
- **Delay dial:** Delay dial is the time or delay that occurs from the time a number has been dialled until the caller or called party hears ringing. Time can be set to between 0~7 seconds
- **Call Ended Toast Dial:** After the call ends, a notification will show on screen about the duration of your call.

The default is 3 seconds, and can be set to a max of 20 seconds or disabled.

### **Voice Call settings**

Voicemail: You will need to setup your voicemail number before you can access this feature, contact your mobile service provider for the settings. Select [Service] and choose [My carrier], then select [Setup] to enter the [Voicemail number] with the [left soft key]. Once the correct number has been entered, press down and select [OK] or [Cancel] to exit.



Call forwarding: You can set to divert incoming calls to another phone number. This is normally set to the voicemail number or another phone number.

- 1. Always forward: This setting redirects all incoming calls to another phone number. Press [OK] to enter a phone number and enable this function. Once complete, press down and select [Enable] to save or [Cancel] to exit. To disable this function, press [OK] and select [Disable] to save.
- 2. Forward when busy: This setting redirects all incoming calls to another phone number if the phone line is busy. Phone line can be busy if the number is calling out, you're not in a service area or you're using Call waiting and already have two callers on the line. Press [OK] to enter a phone number and enable this function. Once complete, press down and select [Enable] to save or [Cancel] to exit. To disable this function, press [OK] and select [Disable] to save.
- 3. Forward when unanswered: This setting redirects all incoming calls to another phone number if the call isn't answered within a specified number of rings. Press [OK] to enter a phone number and enable this function. Once complete, press down and select [Enable] to save or [Cancel] to exit. To disable this function, press [OK] and select [Disable] to save.
- 4. Forward when unreachable: This setting redirects all incoming calls to another phone number if the phone ever loses registration for any reason. Press [OK] to enter a phone number and enable this function. Once complete, press down and select [Enable] to save or [Cancel] to exit. To disable this function, press [OK] and select [Disable] to save.

Call barring: Call barring lets you stop certain types of calls being made from the phone. This feature is network independent. Please contact your network operator for setup of this feature. The default password is 1234. Available options are:

- 1. All outgoing calls: This will block your phone from making all calls (except emergency & toll-free calls). You will be prompted for the password, press down and select [OK] to save or [Cancel] to exit. Repeat the above to disable this feature
- 2. Cancel all: Cancel all configured barring. You will be prompted for the password, press down and select [OK] to save or [Cancel] to exit.
- 3. Change barring password: You can change/set a pin on this feature prevent tampering. You will be prompted for the password, press down and select [OK] to save. You will be required to enter and confirm a new password, press down and select [OK] to save. At any stage you can select [Cancel] to exit.

Additional settings: Here you can see settings for Caller ID and Call waiting. This feature is network independent. Please contact your network operator for setup of this feature.

- 1. Caller ID: You can set the CLI of the phone to display: [Network default], [Hide number], [Show number]. Press [Left soft kev] to save or [Right soft kev] to cancel.
- 2. Call waiting: Enable/Disable to notify you of a new incoming call when you on an existing call. This feature must be enabled before the phone can receive any additional incoming call. If disabled, new caller will be prompted that "the number you have dialled does not exist, please redial carefully"

#### **Fixed Dialling Number settings**

Enable FDN: This feature is network independent; you will be required to enter the SIM PIN2 to unlock the service. Contact your mobile operator for assistance.

Change PIN2: You can change your current SIM PIN2. You will be required to enter your current PIN2 before you can set a new PIN2.

FDN list: When FDN is enabled, only numbers or prefixes listed here can be called to. Press [OK] and select [Add contact]. Enter the Name and Number of the contact which can receive outgoing calls.

### 10.4 Date & time



Under the Date & time settings, you have the option to:

- Automatic date & time: By default, this option is enabled. The date & time is set to network-provided time
- Automatic time zone: Enable to automatically update the time zone set by the service provider
- Set date/time/time zone: These options will be greyed out if Automatic date & time/time zone is enabled. You must disable the Automatic options in order to manually set the date/time/time zone
- Use 24-hour format: Enable to display time in 24-hour format. Disable for 12-
- Choose date format: Select between Regional; MM/DD/YYYY; DD/MM/YYYY; YYYY/MM/DD date format

### 10.5 Wireless & network



Under the Wireless & network settings, you have the option to:

- Wi-Fi: Settings for connecting the phone to an existing wireless network
- Tethering & portable hotspot: Settings for setting up the phone for tethering or wireless hotspot
- Mobile network: Settings for Data connection, Data roaming, Network mode and Access Point Name (APN). You can set up data account to access internet service. For more information, please see page 42. Please contact your Service Provider for specific settings.

To see available networks, you will need to turn Wi-Fi on. To do this, press [OK] → [Enable]. To turn off the Wi-Fi, press [OK] → [Disable].

If you do not see your wireless network, try scanning for it by pressing [OK] → [Scan].



How to connect to a wireless network

- Once Wi-Fi has been turned on, you will see a list of available wireless networks in your area
- To connect to a wireless network, scroll up or down and highlight the name of the network you want to connect to, select  $[OK] \rightarrow [Connect to network]$

#### **Tethering & portable hotspot settings**

USB tethering: One-on-One internet connection between the device and your laptop or computer. First you will need to connect a device to the phone using a USB cable (using the phone's USB power jack as the connection point). From the home screen navigate [Menu]→[Settings]→[Wireless & networks]→[Tethering & portable hotspot]→[USB tethering] to enable it. Your computer will now be able to connect to the internet through the phone if it has a positive data balance and the correct Mobile network has been setup. This method is only recommended if your laptop, computer or device does not support Wi-Fi connection. If your device has Wi-Fi, it is recommended to use Wi-Fi tethering/hotspot as your connection method

#### Hotspot & tethering settings: Select between IPv4 or IPv4 & IPv6

Wi-Fi tethering (Wi-Fi hotspot): You can set up the phone to act as a Wireless Hotspot.

You can connect up to 8 users.

From the home screen navigate [Menu]  $\rightarrow$  [Settings]  $\rightarrow$  [Wireless & networks]  $\rightarrow$  [Tethering & portable hotspot]  $\rightarrow$  [Wi-Fi hotspot].

Alternatively, press the [WIFI] key from the home screen.



#### How to make a Wi-Fi hotspot

- [Menu]→[Settings]→[Wireless & networks]→[Tethering & portable hotspot]→[Wi-Fi hotspot]
- Select [Set up Wi-Fi hotspot] to configure Network SSID and Password
- Select [WLAN Switch] to Enable/Disable the Wi-Fi hotspot
- Select [Keep Wi-Fi hotspot on] to keep the hotspot on if phone is on idle, or turn off after 5/10 min idle
- It is recommended to configure your Network SSID and Password before enabling the WLAN Switch  $\,$

**D-Link**Building Networks for People



- The phone comes pre-set with default Network SSID and Password for the Wi-Fi hotspot. You can modify these settings by scrolling with the [Up/Down] Key to the field which needs to be reconfigured
- Wireless password must have at least 8 characters
- You can view the Password set by marking the [Show password] function
- It will also make setting a Password easier if you mark the [Show password] function before configuring the password. This way you can see what you are typing. To change the input method, press the # key to switch between en/ EN/ Num. To input special characters, press the \* key
- You can change the Security method between None or WPA2 PSK
- Should you wish to reset network SSID, security and password back to default, select [Reset OOB]
- Once complete, scroll all the way down to the bottom and select [Save] or discard all changes with [Cancel]
- You can view all connected users as well as blocked users below
- You can see the connected users MAC and IP address
- To block a user, select the user from the connected users list and press the [Left soft key]. Their MAC will be moved over to blocked users
- To unblock a user, select the user from the blocked users list and press the [Left soft key]. Their MAC will be moved over to connected users

**Mobile Networks (APN):** Here you will find the settings for Mobile network connection. You can set up data account to access internet service. The required Network Settings for your phone has been preloaded. For Telkom users, the default APN settings has been preloaded for you.



Should the desired Network Settings not reflect here, you can manually enter it here:

**Steps to Follow:** Press [Mobile networks]→[Access Point Names]→[New APN]. Enter the Name and APN settings provided by your Mobile service provider.

Note: For Network specific settings, please contact your Network Operator.

### 10.6 Quick number

You can set the M1 – M4 quick dial keys (located on the face of the phone) by:

To Edit, select the M# and press [OK]. Input the number and select [Save]→[Save].

If you have the number saved in your Contacts, press [Save]  $\rightarrow$  [From contact]  $\rightarrow$  Choose the number  $\rightarrow$  [OK]  $\rightarrow$  [Save]  $\rightarrow$  [Save].

To delete, select the M# and press  $[OK] \rightarrow Clear$  all numbers  $\rightarrow [Save] \rightarrow [Save]$ .

## 10.7 Security

**Set up SIM card lock:** Set SIM PIN lock to on or off, or modify SIM PIN. Note that the SIM PIN number is issued by your network provider and is shown on your Complete SIM card. If a SIM PIN is set, it will be indicated with a tick.

## 10.8 Fast dialling

You can set Numbers or Contacts to have speed dial functions here. This allows you to dial a number by pressing and holding down the corresponding numeric key in the Home Screen. To set this, select the number position of where you wish to set the speed dial and press  $[OK] \rightarrow Input$  the number then  $\rightarrow [Save] \rightarrow [Save]$ . If you have the number saved in your Contacts, press  $[Save] \rightarrow [From contact] \rightarrow Choose the number <math>\rightarrow [OK] \rightarrow [Save] \rightarrow [Save]$ .

To delete, select the M# and press  $[OK] \rightarrow Clear$  all numbers  $\rightarrow [Save] \rightarrow [Save]$ .

### 10.9 Bluetooth

The phone can pair to other Bluetooth supported devices for file transfer, speaker, or headset etc.



#### Available Options:

- Set Bluetooth On or Off
- Set Visibility On or Off
- Scan for available Bluetooth devices in area

How to pair with another device

- [Menu] $\rightarrow$ [Settings] $\rightarrow$ [Bluetooth] $\rightarrow$ [OK] $\rightarrow$ [On] $\rightarrow$ [OK]
- Select the device which you wish to pair with by scrolling through the Available devices list with [Up/Down] → [OK] → [Pair]
- The phone will provide you with a pairing code, make sure the same pairing code is displayed on the pairing device.
- If the pairing code match, press [Pair] on both the Phone and pairing device

If you have a SD Card inserted in the Phone, you can transfer files between the Phone and another device. Make sure the Phone is paired successfully with the device which you wish to transfer to/from and there is sufficient memory on the SD card.

## 10.10 Factory Data Reset

Use this function if you wish to restore the phone back to factory settings. All personal information, data stored will be erased and you cannot reverse this action.

To do this navigate [Menu]  $\rightarrow$  [Settings]  $\rightarrow$  [Factory data reset]  $\rightarrow$  [Erase everything]  $\rightarrow$  [OK]


The phone will now proceed to erase and restore the phone back to factory settings, during this process the phone will reboot a few times. This process should take about 1-2 min.

### 10.11 Phone Info

Here you can view the Phone's information such as Status, Model number, Android version, Baseband version, Kernel version and Build number

To view additional information such as My Phone Numbers, IMEI, IP address, Bluetooth address, Wi-Fi MAC address and Up time, Select [Menu]→[Settings]→[Status]



- To change the radio channel level, use the Up and Down directional keys







## 15. Music

Important Note: In order to completely turn OFF the Music Player, you must navigate to the Music feature and use [Quit] under the player to close the Music Player. By pressing [Quit] under the Library or the [Red Hang Up Key] will only minimize the Music Player to the background. The Music Player will pause when you pick up the handset to dial or when receiving a call. The Music Player will return when the call ends.



### In the home screen, select [Menu] $\rightarrow$ [Music] $\rightarrow$ [OK]

#### Music Library

If you have audio files loaded onto the SD Card, the phone will auto detect the files and list it in the Library.

Press [Play] to start playing the selected music Or press [Quit] exit back to the Menu Screen

or press [Quit] exit back to the Menu Screen



Once the music plays, you can press [Option] for selections such as:

- Pause: Pause the current playing music
- Library: List of music available, press to take you back to the previous screen
- Use as ringtone: Set the current playing audio as the ringtone
- **Shuffle:** Enable to play songs in a randomized order. When enabled, the shuffle icon will be blue
- **Repeat:** Enable to repeat play songs, select it once to repeat all songs, select again to repeat current song. When enabled on repeat all, the repeat icon will be blue. When on repeat current song, the icon is blue with a 1 next to the loop
- **Delete:** Remove the song from the microSD card
- Quit: Use to completely turn OFF the Music Player

## 16. Frequently Asked Questions

If any problems are encountered while using the phone, please refer to below FAQs. If the problems still exit, please contact the Network Operator.

Q. Who can I contact for technical support regarding SIM, Airtime, SMS, Voicemail etc?

A. You can call Telkom Customer Care on 081 180 from the mobile number, or 10210 from the landline.

Q. "Enter PIN code" appears on the screen.

A. Enter the PIN code of your SIM card. Please contact your Network Provider immediately if you do not know the code

Q. "Enter PUK code" appears on the screen.

**A.** Your SIM card will be locked if you enter wrong PIN code for three times. To unlock your SIM card, you have to enter PUK code. Enter the PUK code of your SIM card. Please contact your Network Provider immediately if you do not know the code.

Q. The Phone charger/antenna is broken, who can I contact to purchase another charger/antenna?

A. You can call Telkom Customer Care on 081 180 from the mobile number, or 10210 from the landline.



Q. "Insert SIM card" appears on the screen.

**A.** Make sure the SIM card is correctly installed. Check if the SIM card works properly in another device where possible. SIM card may be defective or faulty. Please contact you Network Provider for a SIM swop if faulty.

Q. Poor sound quality, echo or noise makes communication difficult.

**A.** Hang-up your phone and dial again. The Network may connect the phone to a line with better communication quality. If the problem persists, please contact you Network Provider.

Q. "Not in-service area. Network failure." is displayed.

**A.** Check the signal indicator. If there is no signal, you may be in the basement or network blind area in a building. Please move to other locations to receive signal. Or potentially you are not in a coverage area. If so, please contact your Network Provider for assistance.

#### Q. Battery Life Short/Decreases.

**A.** Signal at your location is weak so that the phone has to search signal for a long time. When you don't want to answer any calls, please power off. It is also possible that the battery has been used for a long time and approaches its life-span. In this case, please replace the battery.

Q. My phone screen keeps returning to the Home Page by itself

A. Check that the Return to Home Page feature is not enabled. If you don't want this feature, disable it.

Q. I can't play my music/video file from the File Manager

A. Check that the file is correct and supported. To check for a list of support formats, refer to page 14.

Q. I can't access the internet.

**A.** Check that you have a positive data balance on the SIM card. To check, dial \*188# on Telkom. To purchase data through the Telkom USSD function, dial \*180# and follow the on screen instructions.

Also check that the correct APN settings has been selected. To check the APN settings, refer to page 43

Q. Phone fails to boot.

**A.** Your battery may be completely flat. Please charge your phone until the battery power is restored, then try to power on again. Check the charger to see if it's working properly and proper contact is being made with the Phone USB jack.

Q. Cannot send short messages.

**A.** Please check the SMS address if the correct number has been set. Perhaps the recipient contact number is invalid. Please also check if there is sufficient fund to send SMS.

Q. Cannot add entries into phonebook

A. Phonebook is full. Please delete some un-used entries.

 $\mathbf{Q.}$  Cannot charge.

A. There are three possibilities:

- Charger of your phone does not work properly. You will need to contact your Operator or Supplier
- Poor contact. Please check plug of your charger.
- The battery is old and needs replacement. You will need to contact your Operator or Supplier.
